Dear Friends,

There I was, minding my own business, driving along the A14, when suddenly a VW Campervan decked out 1960's style, flowers, rainbows and other images from that glorious era, flew past me uncomfortably close, with a large number of young people wearing huge smiles leaning out of the windows and waving furiously at me. I can't remember what went through my mind but it was probably intolerance, until I spotted the Ichthys¹ on the back of their vehicle. They were a group of young Christians² who had spotted the same symbol on the back of my car, so I waved just as furiously and smiled back.

I spent some time reflecting on the change in my attitude from grumpy to pure joy in sharing, albeit in a rather strange way, the joy and fellowship of Christianity. I have often met new friends by spotting the 'sign of the fish' on vehicles and lapels. Though I did get a strange reaction from someone I know who said that they wouldn't put an Ichthys on their car because they didn't want people to know that Christians can be bad drivers! It's the saddest excuse I've ever heard. I proudly display mine to let people know that Christians can be bad drivers, that in many respects we are no different to anyone else.

Many religions have very obvious ways of displaying their faith, but how many of us show the whole world that we are Christian by the very simple means of a badge or brooch. Necklaces don't count unfortunately as very many people even devout atheists wear them just as an item of jewellery. I use to assume that a cross or crucifix worn in this way was an emblem of faith, sadly this is not true.

It's Lent, we are approaching Easter, what better way of being a 'fisher of men' why not wear a Christian sign? You never know, someone may ask about your 'bait', just think where that may lead.

NEWS FROM WILBY SCHOOL

On 21 & 22 January Ofsted came to inspect Wilby School, and we are pleased to announce that our school has been identified as 'Good with some areas of outstanding practice'. This was our first inspection in over eight years; since then there have been many changes to the way Ofsted assess schools and their expectations have significantly increased.

The inspector recognised that our pupils make good, and often outstanding, progress with attainment in reading, writing and mathematics in 2014 and 2013 being amongst the highest in the country. He also identified that the school's work to keep pupils safe was outstanding, and that staff ensure Wilby C. of E. Primary School is a safe and secure place to learn. Our Governing Body was identified as an area of strength with Governors clearly understanding their role and being effective in ensuring pupils achieve well. The report also recognised the School's strengths in supporting pupils' spiritual, moral, social and cultural development through the broad range of subjects covered. The caring and nurturing ethos displayed by all within the school was also noted and the inspector felt this prepares the pupils well for life in modern Britain. The inspector was also impressed by our pupils, commenting that the children showed good relationships with each other and were courteous and respectful to all. The school was also recognised for the opportunities our pupils have to excel in sport, music and the arts. The inspector finished his verbal report by saying that, if he had a child of primary school age, he would be very happy for them to attend our school.

Whilst we are pleased to obtain our 'Good' grading under this new, much more demanding framework, we are not complacent and will be working with determination to further improve outcomes and opportunities for all our pupils. As reminder, the school's toddler playgroup ('**Tea & Toys**') is now a weekly event – **Thursdays from 9 til 10:30am**. Any parents, grandparent or carer and children (up to age 5) from the local area are warmly welcome. We are sure this will complement other playgroups nearby. Come for a cuppa and meet others with pre-school children.

Wilby C of E Primary School is also very pleased to announce the imminent arrival of our new school mini-bus. It ensures our children will continue to participate in education beyond the school grounds. The school would like to thank all those people, past and present, who make or make up our Friends of Wilby School Association (FoWSA); they have organised and supported fundraising events which has provided the funds for our bus.

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS - March 2015

The Parish Council will be reconstituted on 7th May 2015. Currently there are seven members of the Council, one of whom Matt Stanford is standing down due to business commitments. We are most grateful to Matt for the contribution he has made to the Council's deliberations and decisions and the perspective he has brought as a member of the farming community.

If you wish to serve the community of Wilby and influence its future and have experience or qualifications that would be of benefit to the Parish Council, please contact the Clerk, Mrs Julie Collett on 01986 798258 to register your interest, to obtain further information and to be provided with nomination papers. The qualifying criteria for membership of the Council are that you must: be aged over 18; be a citizen of the United Kingdom, Republic of Ireland or other member state of the European community or a qualifying Commonwealth citizen; have resided in the parish or within 4.8 kilometres of it during the whole of the previous twelve months; and must not be disqualified from being elected (by being employed by Wilby Parish Council, being adjudged bankrupt or having been convicted of an offence leading to imprisonment of not less than three months).

Everyone, including existing Councillors, seeking election to the Council will have to submit a completed nomination paper (signed by a proposer and seconder from the electoral roll in Wilby) to the Returning Officer by no later than Thursday 9 April 2015. A poll will only be held if the number of valid nominations is more than the seven seats available on the Council, failing which the nominees will be elected as Parish Councillors without a contest.

Next Meeting

ST LAWRENCE'S CHURCH, BRUNDISH - RESTORATION

The Development Phase of this project is now complete and we are delighted to announce that the Heritage Lottery Fund has confirmed approval of the award of a grant towards the Delivery Phase of the project of £136,300.

This is wonderful news and means that work can now commence on these essential works, which will keep our lovely old church safe, sound and waterproof! Allowing future generations the opportunity to appreciate and this beautiful building.

Work will commence in Spring 2015 and hopefully all will be completed by early Autumn. The total project cost is £177,616 and with recoverable VAT and funds already raised, fund raising efforts continue to meet the shortfall of £9,500.

We are fortunate indeed to have received this grant and we look forward to everyone's ongoing support as we continue to raise funds over the coming months. We are extremely grateful to the Clarke & Simpson Charity Committee for their generous donation of £500 to the appeal. All documentation for the delivery phase has now been completed thanks to two further significant anonymous donations and we await Permission to Start from the Heritage Lottery Fund.
