

Dear Friends,

Some time ago I was talking to a man who claimed to be a Christian man and he wanted to know where I stood on other religions. I said, "are we talking within Christianity or globally"? "Oh not Christians," he said, "no them others, you know Muslims and that Islamic stuff and Catholics." His grasp of the subject was somewhat wanting but he continued, "I think they should all burn in hell." As Christians, (and yes before I get phone calls that does include Catholics, I was one once), we believe in a God who loves all his creation and delights in the smallest acts of love and kindness. I couldn't help feeling that we didn't worship the same God.

That we live in a multi-cultural society and that in reality we all worship the same God have long been the politically correct things to say. For some years now there has been pressure in our schools to teach that all religions are the same sort of thing – all have holy people and holy books and holy places. Such a view, however, lacks integrity, because what the various faiths teach and believe about those people, books and places can be quite different. As opposed to political correctness, honesty compels us to say that we do not all hold the same image of God.

As Christians we do not worship a god who decrees that women accused of adultery should be executed, in public by stoning. We have Biblical authority for that (St John 8.1-11). We do not believe in a god who promises that suicide bombers who kill and injure their fellow human beings will be rewarded in heaven. We do not believe that we have to earn our own salvation by living many lives in different forms. We believe in God who loved us enough to become one of us in Jesus of Nazareth and who saves and forgives and restores.

That is not say that we may not recognize truth and goodness in whatever faith we find it. It does not mean only Christians are saved and it does not mean people of other faiths and of no faith at all will not find a path to God. But we do believe that salvation was made possible for all because of what Jesus did in the time of his incarnation.

In the current climate there is great need for a dialogue with those of other faiths – not with a view to their conversion, but with a view to understanding. We need to listen to one another and try to understand one another. Difference is not a threat it is an indication of the richness of creation.

We are called Christians because we believe in Christ and his message of love but that is not enough. We should rather be called Christians because we live the open life of love and compassion that Jesus did. As to who is saved and who is not? Jesus told us do not worry about that for that is God's business.

### **The start of another year! Welcome back all.**

Over the summer the school has had some great improvements, such as new flooring throughout the main hallway, painting and a clever mezzanine in the nursery.

This term our after school clubs include gymnastics, Minecraft, science and gardening (all free) as well as football, dodgeball and yoga (chargeable).

Our breakfast club runs every morning from 8am. Each day has a different theme, such as: colouring, construction, indoor climbing frame and dodgeball.

In the first few weeks of school our greening club has had an apple sale, we celebrated European languages day (starting with a French breakfast!), a coffee morning for MacMillan, held an 'Open School' afternoon, commenced the weekly swimming lessons and held the AGM of Friends of Wilby School Association (FoWSA).

The first few 'Wilby Stars' of the year have included: "for super listening", "for writing an amazing story", "for settling in well and taking part in all activities with enthusiasm", and "for excellent work in literacy, developing the use of connectives, and working so hard".

## NEWS FROM WILBY PARISH COUNCIL

October 2015

The Parish Council met on Wednesday 2 September 2015. We still have two vacant posts on the council. **If you feel you would like to contribute to our community by serving on the Parish Council then please contact the Chairman ( Ian Williamson – 01379 388034 or the Clerk – Julie Collett – 01986 798258).**

### **Defibrillator**

The meeting was preceded by a comprehensive presentation from the Community Heartbeat Trust on the defibrillator. Statistics show that the correct use of the defibrillator combined with immediate CPR increases the chances of surviving a cardiac arrest from 5% to 75%. The council agreed in principle to the provision of a defibrillator for Wilby to be located in the telephone box. The council is keen to proceed with the project but it requires local volunteers ,willing to be trained in the use of the defibrillator and the associated first aid training , who could act in an emergency. **If you are interested in learning more about the defibrillator and potentially saving a life, please contact Todd Strehlow – 07985 411289 or by email [toddstrehlow@yahoo.com](mailto:toddstrehlow@yahoo.com)**

### **Village Survey**

Plans for the Village Survey were agreed and by the time you read this the survey will have been delivered to you. The surveys will be collected on 3/4 October or can be left in a marked box in the porch of the church sealed in the envelopes provided. ### **Village Sign**

The Village Hall Committee has proposed that Wilby has a village sign. The council awaits further information on the proposal eg location, design, costs etc. before making any commitment.

### **Wilby E-mail Register**

It is clear that many residents do not pick up information provided by the Parish Council in the Parish newsletter or on the Parish notice board. For example no members of the public responded to the invitation to attend the defibrillator presentation and very few attended the Annual Parish Meeting. To improve communication in the village, notably in passing on important information to residents, it is intended to establish an e-mail register for exclusive use by the Parish Council.

**Inclusion on the register will be entirely voluntary. Details will be issued with the Village Survey, including the terms and conditions under which the register will be used.**
