Dear Friends

I love a party! But that's not always been the case. As a toddler, I was far too shy to enjoy social gatherings of any sort, and preferred to hide behind my Mum rather than join-in as all the other youngsters seemed to do. It perhaps had something to do with being "*a unique child*" – I much preferred the company of adults, and was a rather grown-up little boy. I think it fair to say I have regressed – since Ordination I discovered the child within me, and have enjoyed being childlike ever since! I now love parties, so to have yet another excuse for a national party seems a great idea.

The Queen's 90th Birthday – what a great thing to celebrate, especially as she is still very much "*on top of the job*".

The Queen herself has actually underplayed the occasion; it's the rest of us who have been making such a fuss. However, she has used the opportunity to give thanks for the source of her strength, and in an unprecedented move she has been involved in the publication of a remarkable little book, "*The Servant Queen and the King She Serves*." Compiled by Mark Green and Catherine Butcher, the book focuses on the Queen's own words to show how her faith has shaped her life and work.

The main thrust of the book, as the title suggests, is our Queen's steadfast commitment to service – service to the nation and its people, service to the Commonwealth of Nations, and above all, service to God. In her Christmas broadcast of 2008 she said, "*I hope that, like me, you will be comforted by the example of Jesus of Nazareth who, often in circumstances of great adversity, managed to live an outgoing, unselfish and sacrificial life. He made it clear that genuine human happiness and satisfaction lie more in giving rather than receiving; more in serving than in being served.*" In a strong statement of faith, the Queen has said that she is 'very grateful' to the nation for its prayers for her and that she has felt God's 'faithfulness' during her 64 years on the throne. "*I know just how much I rely on my faith to guide me through the good times and the bad...I know that the only way to live my life is to try to do what is right, to take the long view, to give of my best in all that the day brings and to put my trust in God.*"

The book is intended to be both a gift and a conversation-starter. Our Queen has been unashamedly open about her faith in Christ. Let us make the best of this opportunity that her Ninetieth Birthday has afforded, in sharing her testimony with as many as we can, as we continue to thank God for Her Majesty the Servant Queen, and for her faithful witness to the King of Kings.

Fostering Teenagers

Do you have a spare bedroom and experience in caring for children - have you ever thought about fostering?

Suffolk County Council is urgently looking for new foster carers, in particular for teenagers. Over half of the children in care are aged 11 or over, yet fewer people come forward to offer care for them. Therefore many teenagers may not be living with Suffolk carers, and will be away from friends, school and their local community. This is where you come in!

In return, the county council provide a highly competitive payment scheme, where you can receive up to £606 per week per child. The scheme allows career opportunities as you develop as a foster carer, recognising your skills, experience and the type of fostering you are offering.

Having problems with your broadband speed? These ideas might help.

I'm a retired Communications Research Engineer and would like to add my observations to the Wilby/Broadband debate.

I was struck by the range of broadband speeds reported at the Wilby parish questionnaire results meeting on the 24th February. Considering we are all broadly the same distance from the Stradbroke exchange, I would have expected a narrower range of speeds, so why the range? In my own case, I have found in the past that old internal phone wiring can reduce broadband speed. Back in the day when telephones were fitted with real bells, extensions were wired so that the transmission circuits were in parallel and the bells were in series because they needed a lot of current. Each new extension would lead to more and more wiring.

These days the ringer is low current and can be integrated with the transmission circuit. This means that phones can be simply connected in parallel with two conductors. Additionally, cordless phones are easily available and do away with wiring.

Fitting a BT iplate onto your master socket will disconnect the extension bell wire for you and leave you with only the connections you need for a modern telephone and ADSL router setup. The bell wire can act as an aerial and introduce unwanted noise into the signal.

Each telephone requires an ADSL filter so that the phone doesn't interfere with the broadband router signals. Some filters do their job better than others and it worthwhile getting the best ones you can find.

Finally, it's worth knowing that each ADSL enabled line has what's called an IP profile. This is a throttle or restriction on the rate at which data can be sent down the line and is part of the exchange management system as there is no point in sending data at a rate faster than can be utilised. Imagine that if Andy Murray could return a maximum of one ball a second, if you send him two balls a second, he is still limited by his maximum!

The upshot is that if you can improve your broadband speed by simplifying your wiring etc, the IP profile won't track your improvements for a couple of days. To see the IP profile for your line, if you are with BT, go to <http://www.speedtest.btwholesale.com/> and complete the test including the further diagnostics.
