Dear Friends,

One of the less attractive traits of human beings is the way we load expectations on to people that are unrealistic and unfair. Then, when the expectations are not met, we criticise the others, not ourselves.

Jesus was well aware of what people wanted him to be and do. He knew he could not be the conquering liberator of their imagination because his path was to lead to defeat and death – something very hard for his followers to accept. St Luke tells us that even when Jesus hung on the cross ‘the leaders scoffed at him, saying *“He saved others; let him save himself if he is the Messiah of God, his chosen one!”*’ The soldiers also mocked him, coming up and offering him sour wine, and saying, *“If you are the King of the Jews, save yourself!”* (Luke 23:35-37.) These must have been bitter words for the Son of God to hear, when he knew that he could have summoned legions of angels to release him from the cross, but chose not to.

In that choice he in fact exceeded all expectation. Instead of liberating the nation he sacrificed himself so that every man, woman and child in the world could come back to God. That’s how much he loved us.

Sometimes if we let our relatives, friends, the local school, the NHS or whoever it may be off the hook and not pile a weight of expectation upon them, they may in fact deliver in a way that we had never thought of. No-one on that first Good Friday believed that Jesus would rise again, although he had told them he would. On Easter Day he turned defeat into victory and silenced the mockery of his enemies by a far greater miracle than stepping down from the cross would have been. However, he still didn’t do what we might have expected, namely to appear to the Jewish leaders and Roman soldiers. Instead he appeared secretly to his friends, that not very wonderful bunch of disciples. Gradually the message that he was alive again spread and spread, so that now all round the world people can rejoice in God’s great work in saving lost humanity. He has done far more than we could ask, or think, or deserve. It’s a secret that we can all share in one of our churches this Holy Week and Easter as we proclaim *‘Christ has died; Christ is risen; Christ will come again!’*

As part of this Jaya Dance company joined us to explore storytelling through dance. Children, staff and even parents joined us in a variety of dance workshops throughout the day.

Arithmetic morning

Parents joined us for an introduction to Maths Calculation Methods and then attended a variety of workshops across all three key stages. The morning was very well received and parents told us that they wanted more! As a result each class will be offering a minimum of two Parent Sessions each term. NEWS FROM WILBY PARISH COUNCIL

The following matters of community interest arose at the Parish Council meeting on 1 March 2017.

Defibrillator - ARE YOU WILLING TO HELP A NEIGHBOUR ?

Now that our defibrillator has been installed (in the telephone kiosk outside Wilby School), we have the option of setting up a telephone system to help anyone needing to use the equipment. The system is called VETS (Village Emergency Telephone System).

VETS will be particularly helpful if only one other person is in the house when someone suffers a cardiac arrest. The first call should always be to 999 to summon an ambulance. Since the patient should not be left alone, the person needing help, after dialing 999, can dial the VETS number which automatically and simultaneously rings a list of volunteers in the village. The first available volunteer is connected to the person in need and the volunteer can collect the defibrillator and provide immediate help and support pending arrival of the ambulance.

The system depends upon volunteers willing to participate in the scheme and being able to help anyone in distress. Although it does not replace 999 calls, it provides reassurance that help is at hand, especially for the elderly, those living alone and the infirm.

Speed Indicator Device

Further progress has been made on the issue of speeding traffic raised in the Village Survey. Following a site visit to the Norfolk manufacturer, Council has agreed to the purchase of a Westcotec Speed Indicator Device (SID). It is hoped that the device will be in place by May. In addition to notifying drivers of their actual speed, the device has the facility to record the speed of all passing vehicles and so it should be possible to isolate persistent offenders, to support any referral to the police.

Planning Applications

Council supported an application to provide a replacement porch at Jackdaw Cottage. The application for an events venue at Tannington was still subject to consideration by the District Council.

Council Tax

The Council Tax levied by the District Council will increase by 1.64% in 2017/18. The Wilby Parish Council component of the Council Tax for Wilby properties will decrease by 0.88%.

Annual Parish Meeting

The Annual Parish Meeting, which is a community and not a church or indeed parish council event, will be held in the Coronation Hall at 7 pm on **Wednesday 3 May 2017**. The event is open to everyone who lives in Wilby and is an opportunity to hear about the activities and plans of village organisations (church, school, village hall etc.) and for individual members of the public to raise any issues of community concern or interest. Refreshments will be provided at the end of the meeting. A warm invitation to attend is extended to all. Parishioners - this is your meeting!

Next meeting

The next meeting of the Parish Council will be held at 7.30 pm on **Wednesday 10 May 2017**. This will be our 2017 Annual Meeting when officers are elected. All are welcome to attend. We are still anxious to increase the membership of the Council, having three vacancies at present and being just quorate at our last meeting. As President Kennedy might have said: *"Think not what your community can do for you but what you can do for your community!"*
